

## Super Silhouettes

Lots of artists use silhouettes and simple shadows in their work. Here are some examples in this great poster by Toulouse Lautrec.

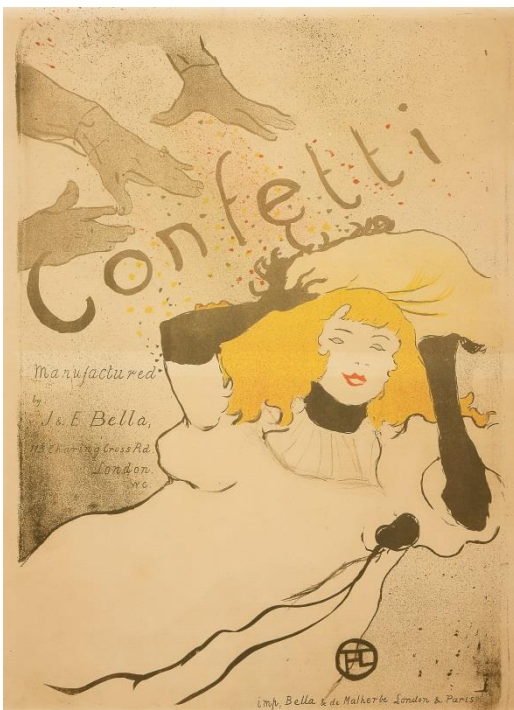

Let's have a go!

- Look around your house for lots of colourful paper. It can be anything – magazines, newspaper, wrapping paper, scrap paper.
- Cut these pieces into strips, and stick onto another piece of paper.
- On a separate piece of white or black paper, draw your design. Make sure it is nice and big!
- Carefully cut out your design from the centre, so you leave a hole in the paper in the outline of your design.



Place your hole-y paper over your coloured strips – your design is now coloured in!

Alternatively, you can cut out shapes in one colour to stick onto coloured strips, it's up to you!

Well done! You have made a silhouette picture!
